Surveyed for John Campbell Guardian of the heirs of William Campbell on the 24<sup>th</sup> Ult. A. Tract of Land Situated partly in Conneottee Township Erie Co., & partly in Venango Township Crawford County, which Tract was settled by Jane Campbell, James Campbells widow who afterwards married a Mr. Fittz Randolph who was a widower, & he the s<sup>d</sup> Randolph supposed that she the s<sup>d</sup> Jane Campbell had conveyed all her right title claim & interest <sup>in s<sup>d</sup> tract</sup> to William Campbell her son as he neither wished nor expected any share in s<sup>d</sup> Tract of Land, but after their marriage it was found that no written conveyance existed between her the s<sup>d</sup> Jane & William her son Therefore something must be done to bring matters as they should be & as he the s<sup>d</sup> Randolph had all along supposed they were, consequently it was at once deemed expedient that he the s<sup>d</sup> Randolph should go forward with Jane his wife & by writing convey to William Campbell Son of the s<sup>d</sup> Jane Campbell all their right title claim & interest in the s<sup>d</sup> Tract of Land which they did do & the writing still exists & is now in the hands of John Campbell (Guardian of the Heirs of William Campbell deceased) who now comes forward with this my Survey with a view to obtain a Patent in Trust for s<sup>d</sup> Heirs

Beginning at the N.E. Corner at a post Thence South by Land of Job Reeder Two hundred & Fourteen Perches to a post, Thence West One hundred & Fifty Eight & one half Perches by Land of Henry Gross to a Post Thence North Two hundred & Fourteen perches to a post by residue of Tract, Thence East One hundred & Fifty Eight perches  $\frac{1}{2}$  by Land of William Campbells heirs to place of beginning Containing Two hundred acres & allowance be the same more or less —
