A Draught of a Tract of land call'd "Brook Vale" Situate on a run known by the name of Bullets run leading into Bald Eagle Creek in Bald Eagle Township Northumberland County, Survey'd the 19<sup>th</sup> day of August 1784 for William Ramsey in Pursuance of two Warrants dated. One dated the 6<sup>th</sup> day of July and the other, the 11<sup>th</sup> day of August 1784. - Containing Four hundred & thirty One Acres & a quarter & allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{4}$  Cent for roads &c<sup>e</sup>.

NOTE. The above two tracts were returned to the owner (as noted on the back of this draft) who neglected to forward to Land Office. I return you the original in preference to a copy to corroborate the age of Survey, Viz. on first warrant, deducting S. Reigert's interference 174<sup>95</sup> 133<sup>95</sup> & Allow. and on the second, less Roland Perry's interference 230<sup>95</sup> 80<sup>95</sup> & Allow. I have made no recalculation of the original returns, but have examined the above interferences and most of the lines, upon the ground, and find them very accurate & well defined considering the great lapse of time.

The land is mostly cleared, and divided among the following persons, viz. William Reynolds, John Hughes, John H. Dopp, & A.J. Goodfellow. The precise date of improvement I am not able to state.
