

Having ascertained where the land lay that is held by John Kennedy's Warrant I called on Josiah Lowry and wife the assignees of John Kennedy and agreed with them on a day to proceed to survey their land ^{before} the affixed time arrived Mr. Lowry presented me with a document of which the following is a true copy and desired me to transmit the same to the land office



In obedience to the above Rule of Court I surveyed the lands of the parties and ascertained the boundaries as is exhibited in the above draught and find no interference in the boundaries. The lines of Josias Lowry's land are represented by dotted lines and the boundaries of Benjamin Wright's land by straight lines.

P.S. Mr. Josias Lowry is the son-in-law of John Kennedy and in possession (as he states) of 160 Acres of the land granted to John Kennedy by warrant bearing date the 10th day of January 1772 and that he contended with Benjamin Wright in the Court of Greene County for the whole quantity of land mentioned in the said Warrant but failed in the suit. If the above draught cannot be accepted in the land office as official Mr. Lowry wishes to be informed of its rejection as he is desirous to apply for a patent shortly

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this

fifth day of January 1906.
