



State of the Case respecting the above Lands in dispute —

Warrant to Andrew Boggs for 300 Acres of Land joining the Lands of the Heirs of Robert M^cConnell decd. James Kelly and the North Mountain in Letterkenny Township in the County of Cumberland — Dated the 23^d August 1784. —

Warrant to Robt. M^cConnell, James M^cConnell, & John M^cConnell for 300 Acres of Land bounded on the North by Land of Patrick Hartford, on the East by lands of the said Robert M^cConnell, James M^cConnell and John M^cConnell and on the West by the North Mountain in Letterkenny Township in the County of Franklin — Dated the 14th. January 1785 —

Being possessed of both Warrants, and having first, in one Survey, taken in the whole of the Lands in question, propos'd to the Parties, for an Accommodation, to divide the same by a Northwest Line as dotted on the Draft, having 300 Acres Southwestward of s^d Line to satisfy Boggs's prior Warrant, which Proposal not being agreeable to either Party, the other dividing Lines were run according to the desire of the Claimants under Boggs's said Warrant alone, whereupon both Parties propos'd to have the Matters in dispute try'd before the Honorable the Board of Property, and desired the same might be returned to that Intent. Survey'd June 2^d 1786.
