Originally Survey'd on Warrant da. the 11th day of April 1774. Granted to George Koons. B. Containing 186 as. 55 pers. of land & allow. being part of 250 as. ^{471 pers.} of land & allow. Survey'd on Warrant da. the 6th day of June 1793 Granted to Henry Huber. C. Containing 43 as. 45 pers. of land & allow. &c. being part of 163 as. 118 pers. of land & allow. Surveyed on Warrant da. the 28th day of March 1751 Granted to John Fisher. And D. Containing 11 acres of land & allow. &c. being part of 287 as. 126 pers. of land & allow. &c. which was surveyed on Warrant da. the 24th day of July 1752. Granted to a certain George Shollinger (alias Tollinger.) The title to said lands is vested in Peter Zimmerman. Copied from the title papers of P. Zimmerman.
