



The above Draught of 161 1/2^a describes a Tract of Land in Possession of Joseph & Samuel Morrison, as purchased by them from Daniel Mc^oConnell, ^{who had Purchased a Part from} William Steel, which appears by their Respective Bill of Sale; It was Survey'd the 11th of the first month (Old Stile) 1746/7, as Land in Dispute between the said Mc^oConnell & Steel by my Father; the Latter had a Warr^t for 50^a Dated 12th October 1745; Mc^oConnell had a Warrant Dated the 22nd of the same month; s^d Steel lived on the Premises, made Improvements, & endeavour'd to Claim & hold the Whole; William Richey also ^{had} obtain'd a Warrant for 25^a adjoining his Plantation bearing Date the 19th April 1744, by which he then laid Claim to a part of this Tract, & wanted it to be executed to take in Meadow Ground on Cananawango Creek; — On Perusing my Father's Papers I find that in the Summer following the Survey of this Tract, he sent a Draught of the Land, with a Representation of the Case to the Land Office for a Decision; The Secretaries Judgment thereupon Dated the 17th of June 1747, was, that W^m Richey's Warrant should be laid upon that part of the Land adjoining him; after which my Father says he went to the Spot, when William Richey refused to take the Land at the Place assign'd him, & said he would rather drop his Warrant than take it there, the Ground was so poor: during all this, William Steel kept his Possession until Daniel Mc^oConnell Purchased him out as above mention'd; thereby as (I believe) expecting he had the whole clear of any further Disputes of any Person whatever, and so sold it with his other Land to the said Morrisons, who have held it now near 14 years, and I expected that William Richey, as he let it pass over in that manner had now no colour to renew my further Dispute about it, as I since by a latter Warrant, made the additional Survey of 4 1/2^a for the said Morrison's as above described, and also last year at their Request, proved & renew'd the Lines B & B. William Richey & his Son being present & Consenting.
