A Draught of a Tract of land Situate in Huntington Township in the County of York Resurveyed the 10th day of June 1787 in Pursuance of a Warr^t. Granted to Michael Miller for 100⁰ dated the 12th September 1745. (The Piece Marked with the letter A was sold by Henry one of the Executors of the said Michael Miller Deceased, to his Brother John Miller during the Time he held the same by Purchase after the Death of his Father; But not having Complied with his Bargain the Whole Tract was Sold for the Debts of the Deceased by the Sheriff of York County as the Records of the Said Court will appear). Containing Three Hundred and Twenty Two Acres and fifty Eight Perches and the Usual Allowance for Roads &c. The Whole Returned In Pursuance of the Order of the Honorable Board of Property of the 6th day of August 1787.
