Directing the Recovery of the Money Due the Commonwealth from Persons holding lands under the Proprietary Government. Original Surveyed to Michael Kough by Warrant of the 16th March 1747. for 148^o 113^o and the allowance of 6 p. C. &c.

By Virtue of the above Mentioned Warrant, Surveyed the 2^d March 1840, to Michael Kofferty in Right of the above named Michael Kough, the above Described Tract of Land, Containing Seventeen acres and twenty four perches and the allowance of 6 p. C. &c. being part of the above Mentioned Tract
