



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in the Eastern District of the City of Wells [formerly Philadelphia] and Province of Pennsylvania
Being Part of a Tract of about 150 Acres more or less taken up by Peter Grubner, by Warrant of the 3^d October anno 1745, who on the 29th October 1751 assigned his Right to John Freyly, who again on the 25th December 1751 to Catherine Keplinger, who by her Deed Roll of the 1st January anno 1759, sold and Conveyed the same unto Peter Bechel, who now intends to Convey the above Tract thereof unto his Son in Law Dewald Lentz. — Beginning at a Stone a Corner of John Leshers Land, thence by the same South West 19 Perches to a Stone set for a Corner of the said Peter Bechels Land. Thence by the same North 64 degrees 9^m West 104^{1/2} perches to a Black Oak sapling and North 9^m East 27^{1/2} perches to a Stone in the Line of Michael Steps Land. Thence by the same, and by Land of George Dyster, North 20^m East 110 perches to a Stone. Thence by the said George Dyster [Late Jacob Boards] Land, East 97 perches to the Place of Beginning. — Containing forty six Acres and 115 Perches of Land Strictly Forty four Acres and 12 Perches of Land, together with the usual Allowance at one per cent for Roads. Surveyed for the said Dewald Lentz on the 25th August anno 1772. —
