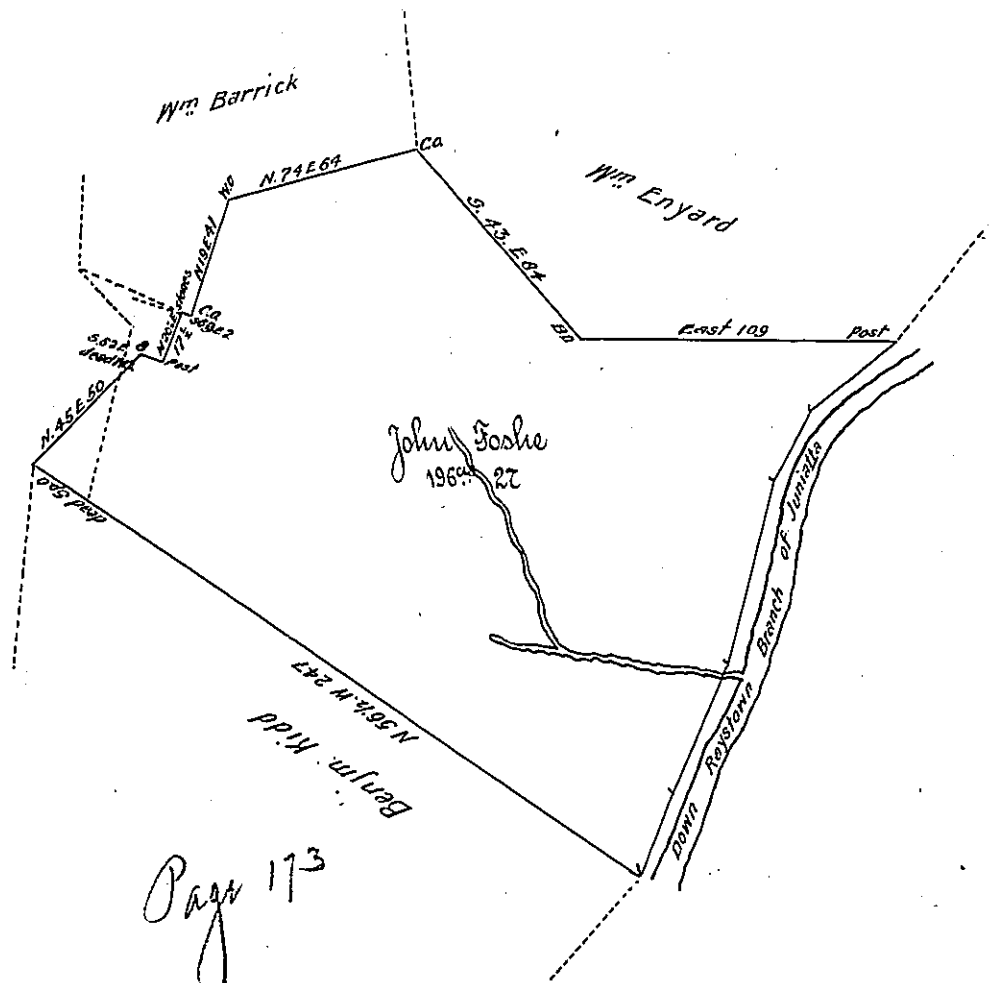

The dotted line represents part of a tract of land surveyed for Joseph Norris on Warrant dated the 20th day of October 1815. this tract interferes Two Acres ^{and one half} with the John Forshee Survey - John Forshee conveyed to Mr Sanders, whose heirs Joshua and Hesekiah Sanders conveyed to Joseph Norris Sen^r who devised the same to Joseph Norris Jr who obtained the aforsaid Warrant and is the present owner
Joseph Norris not Pet^r

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Situate on the west side of the Royston Branch of Juniata - in Hopewell township Huntingdon County - containing one Hundred and ninety six acres and twenty seven perches and allowance - Surveyed the 28th day of April 1850 - on order to John Foshe No. 1210 dated 15th September 1766
