



Situate in Cedars Township, York County, and containing as above set forth 48 $\frac{1}{2}$  13 $\frac{1}{2}$  ac. allowance. Being a part of a larger tract of 83 ac. Surveyed by George McLean late D.S. on the 26<sup>th</sup> & 28<sup>th</sup> days of September 1789, in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date the 19<sup>th</sup> day of February 1789 granted to Henry Strickhouser for 40. Afterwards divided off from the said larger tract, and now, after having been carefully examined, corrected and calculated, at the request of the said Henry Strickhouser, it is returned for confirmation the 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1809.
