



A Draught of a tract of Land situate in Williams Township Northampton County, the dotted Lines Represents, one of the tracts Returned to George Palmer late Deputy, by the late Surveyor General, agreeable to an act passed the 25<sup>th</sup> March 1820, Directing the Recovery of the Money Due the Commonwealth from Persons holding Lands under the Proprietary Government. Original Surveyed to Michael Keough by Warrant of the 16<sup>th</sup> March 1842, for 148<sup>2</sup> 113 P and the allowance of 6 p C. & C.

By virtue of the above warrant, Surveyed the 6 & 7<sup>th</sup> December 1822, by George Palmer late Deputy, to Philip Schiffer, in Right of the above named Michael Keough, the above described Tract of Land containing Twenty Seven acres and Sixty eight Perches and the allowance of 6 p. C. & C. Examined and approved March the 21<sup>st</sup> 1840.

To B. By the Information which I have received there is on said land a House and Barn, and the said Philip Schiffer and his family Residing therew, and the most of the land Cultivated, and hath been improved about 50 or 60 years.
