



Note: Order of Survey dated 20 Nov 1767 No. 4591 granted to Wm Alexander for 150 acres on main branch of Conococheague Creek joining William Anderson, probably was intended for the above Land, or part thereof but no evidence appears of any Survey; or of any person claiming under the same

Note. Some difficulty seems to arise as to the particular location of the above Warrant; whether or no the same would not Locate the dotted figure marked A so as to join James Lindsay as called for in the Warrant. In the year 1767 we find the figure A or that side of the tract recognized as the land of John Andrew.— In the year 1772 we find the figure B or that side of the land recognized as the land of William Dunlop. In the year 1786 we find the whole appearing to be recognized as William Dunlops Meadow- The most ancient Improvement appears seated at the place marked on the draft B- It is probable the whole comprising the two figures A & B may have been claimed by Dunlop; but finding no survey of the whole purporting to be made on his warrant; we have thought best to return the survey on the tract marked B which dont appear to be held by any other office right. The figure A was surveyed 30 May 1825 on Warrant to George Chambers Esq dated 3<sup>d</sup> Feb<sup>y</sup> 1825
