Surveyed to Thomas Caldwell the 1st, 13th, 14th & 15th days of April, 1842 the above described tract of land containing one hundred and ninety two acres and allowance of six per cent (containing also an improvement and actual settlement which I believe from the report of the neighbours was commenced prior to the year A.D. 1814 and has been actually settled ever since) Situate in Centre township Indiana County adjoining lands of Robert Hamilton, John B. Allison and a claim of James Stunkard as above described. By virtue of a warrant granted to Thomas Caldwell the 2nd day of March A.D. 1842.
