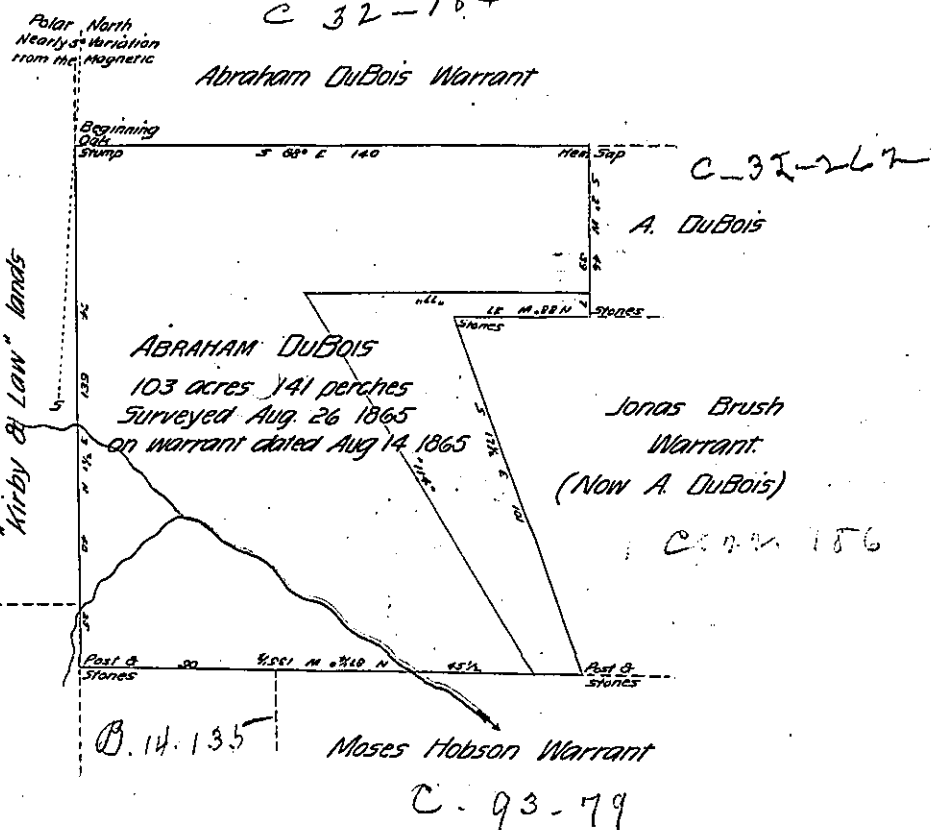

Duplicate Return.

Draft of a tract of land situate in Great Bend township Susquehanna County Penn^a. bounded on the North by land in the Warrantee name of Abraham DuBois (from an Oak Stump to a Hemlock Sapling $S 00^{\circ} E 140$ perches), on the East by lands in the names of Abraham DuBois & Jonas Brush ($S 2^{\circ} W 46 - N 88^{\circ} W 37 - \& S 17 1/2^{\circ} E 101$ perches to a post & stones) on the South by lands in the Warrantee name of Moses Hobson &c ($N 87 1/2^{\circ} W 135 1/2$ perches to a post & stones) and on the West by lands known as the "Kirby & Law" tract in the Warrantee names of _____ $N 1 1/2^{\circ} E 139$ perches to the beginning. Containing 103 acres & 141 perches & allowance of 6 per cent. Surveyed August 26th A.D. 1865 in pursuance of a Warrant bearing date August 10th A.D. 1865 granted to Abraham DuBois By James W. Chapman County Surveyor.

To James P. Barr Esq. Surveyor General. It becomes my duty to state that the above survey includes 86 acs & 58 ps & allowance Surveyed by Wilson J. Turrell former County Surveyor Sept 9 1862 on a Warrant to John Osterhout dated _____ but which Abraham DuBois claims to have legal possession of. The greater portion of it was surveyed as he alleges on a warrant to Jason Wilson many years ago, but the Return of Survey lost. The possession was subsequently transferred to Elias Thomas and conveyed by him to Wm. Crystle by Deed dated June 2^d 1843 regularly recorded & sold at Sheriff's sale some 20 years ago on a suit against Crystle & purchased by said Abraham DuBois who has a Sheriff's Deed of it dated Nov 20 1847 & contracted to sell it to Abram Osterhout who is now upon the land under said contract.
