



Situate on West side of the Raystown Branch of Juniatta-In Hopewell township, Huntingdon County containing Two hundred and one acres and allowance Surveyed the 3rd day of April 1787 on order No. 1214 dated the 13th day of September 1766 granted to John McMath.

The green and River lines represent the draught of A tract of land surveyed for John Owens Jr on order No. 332 dated the 1st day of August 1766- Interferes Two hundred and one acres with the John McMath survey- John Owens Jr conveyed to James Dailey who conveyed to William Blackburn who conveyed to William Morris who lost at law all of the In^o Owens Jr tract that interfered with the In^o McMath survey.

The dotted and river lines represent the draught of a tract of land surveyed for Andrew Simpson on order No. 1461 dated the 10th day of October 1766- This survey interferes one hundred and seventy three Acres & one half with the John McMath survey Andrew Simpson conveyed to Richard Tea Esq^r who appears to have abandoned his title to this survey
