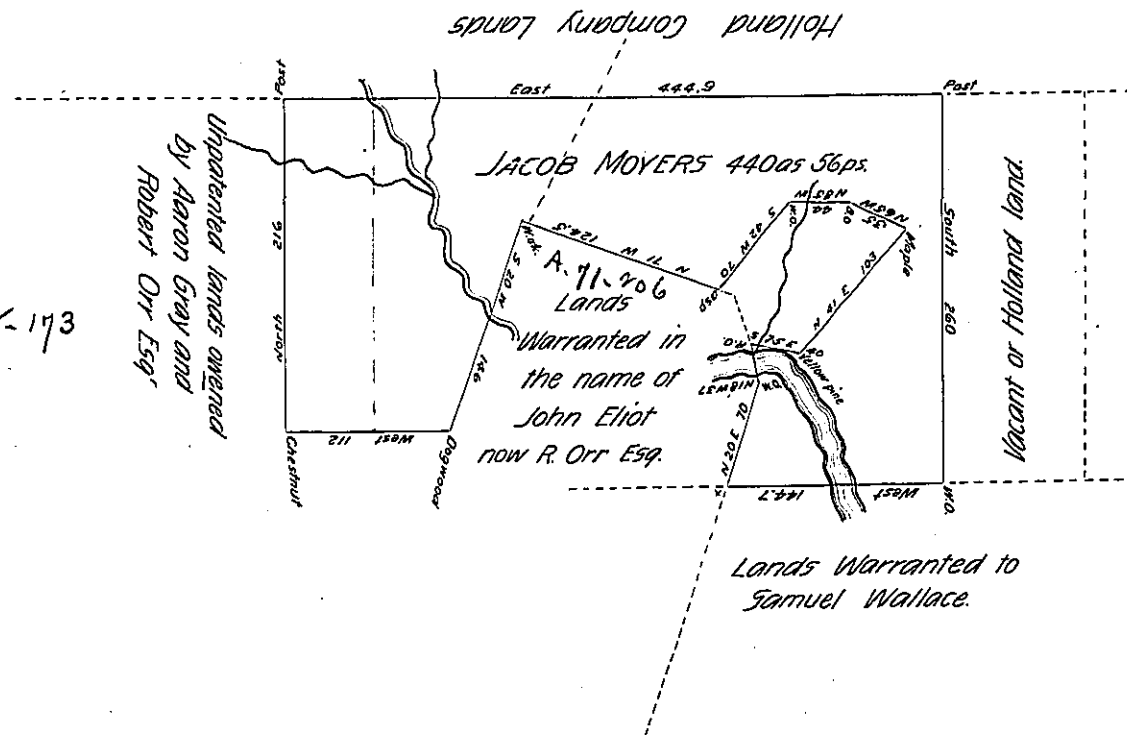

In pursuance of a Warrant Dated December 2<sup>nd</sup> 1837. Granted to Jacob Moyers. Surveyed to the same on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of Feb<sup>y</sup> 1839  
 the above described Tract of land containing four hundred and forty acres fifty six perches and allowance of six per cent &c. Situate in Redbank  
 Township Armstrong County

N. B. Aaron Gray and Robert Orr Esq<sup>r</sup> caveats the exceptance of the above return of Survey alleging that the said Moyers has purchased part of the vacant land from the Holland Company without their agent knowing it as they believe thereby defrauding the Commonwealth of the purchase money of about one hundred and Fifty acres of land and also for having thrown out at another place a vacancy of about forty acres land at a place where it does not adjoin the remaining vacancy on the West which will likely be lost to the Commonwealth and every other person except Jacob Moyers- Also for having surveyed in on his warrant four hundred and forty acres in place of four hundred there by encroaching still farther West upon them and depriving them of their right to a full tract of four hundred acres although they claim under an old improvement and settlement- They are willing for Jacob Moyers to have four hundred acres Surveyed on his Warrant from the Holland land West but not to take.
