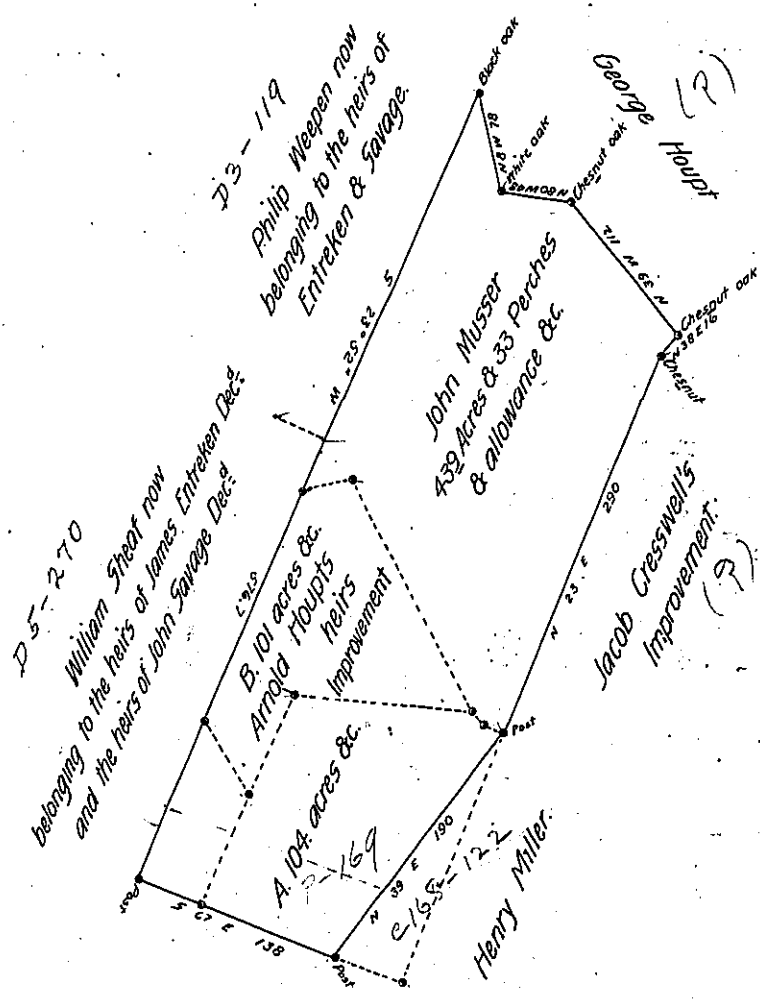

Surveyed first by John Canan Esq<sup>r</sup> the then Dep<sup>y</sup> Surveyor of said County on the 28<sup>th</sup> day of April 1794 in pursuance of a Warrant granted to John Musser for 400 acres dated March 7<sup>th</sup> 1794 and reexamined and corrected the 24<sup>th</sup> day of June A.D. 1852 in pursuance of an Order of Resurvey granted to the trustees and devisees of the estate of John Savage dec'd dated the 6<sup>th</sup> Day of October A.D. 1838.

Note 1<sup>st</sup>. The piece marked A contains about 104 acres and is a part of a survey in the name of James Entreken in his own right who is the acting executor and trustee under the will of James Entreken Esq<sup>r</sup> Dec'd and who by his last will and testament bequeathed the one sixth part of said John Musser Survey to sundry Residuary Legatees &c.

Note 2<sup>nd</sup>. The piece marked B is an Improvement claim of Arnold Hout's heirs the boundaries of which are not defined but supposed to be as above and which it is not intended by the owners of the Musser warrant to dispute so far as their survey is legally defined and established.

Note 3<sup>rd</sup>. The owners of the John Musser Survey have paid the taxes for for the same for the last Twenty Five years &c.
