



The above Draught represents the boundaries of the original claim of James Sloan containing four hundred and eighty three acres forty perches and the allowance of six p<sup>c</sup> &c situate in Kittanning township Armstrong County adjoining lands of Thomas Taylor David Reynolds and others being the same tract of land of which the Return of survey hath been made in pursuance of a warrant granted to Robert Brown Sen<sup>r</sup> Dated Jan<sup>r</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> A. D. 1828. The part represented by the figure including the letter A had been sold by s<sup>d</sup> James Sloan (by right of his improvement) to Robert Beaty and a Conveyance of the same to the latter is recorded in the ~~off~~ Registers of fice of the county by Deed dated April 5<sup>th</sup> 1810 which transaction was unknown to me at the time of the Return mentioned
