The dotted lines represent part of a Survey made for Patrick Leonard and John Cadwallader on Warrant dated the 22^d day of September 1794. This survey interferes one hundred and fifty and one half acres with the Darcus M^cGill tract. Patrick Leonard & John Cadwallader conveyed to Dr Peter Shoemaker the present owner. No. 1 represented by red lines is part of a survey made for Daniel Craffius on Warrant dated the 9th day of June 1794. This survey interferes Sixty two and one half acres with the Darcus M^cGill tract. Daniel Craffius conveyed to John Craffius who conveyed to M^r Longeneor who conveyed to John Johnston who conveyed to Jacob Eberley the present owner. No. 2 represents part of a survey made for William Wilson on Warrant dated the 13th day of April 1773— this survey interferes six and one half acres with the Darcus M^cGill tract. William Wilson conveyed to Abraham Singer who conveyed to William Johnston who devised the same to John Johnston who conveyed to George Rung and Jacob Eberley the present owners. The residue of the Darcus M^cGill tract is claimed by virtue of an Improvement made about 1794 by William Stell Esq^r who conveyed part to Alexander Stell the present owner. William Stell Esq^r owns the residue.
