



Situate on the east side of Monongahela River and is part of a survey made by Moses McClean (then a Deputy Surveyor) for William Shearer in part satisfaction for an Order of Survey in the name of William Shearer and Henry Schreyer No. 615 dated the 3^d day of April 1769 - on the 15th day of June 1770 part of which is controverted by Alexander Teeland as represented by the dotted lines circumscribing Letter C, at the time of making this survey Moses McClean was partner with me in the district, duly authorized. I have lately resurveyed the same and find the lines correct. Alexander Teeland has procured a survey and probably a patent for the part represented, by surprise - it having escaped my notice, as being a part of this survey - Suit in ejectment is pending - patent not to be granted until decided -
