



A Draught of a tract of Land, situate in Upper Salford Township, in the County of Montgomery in the State of Pennsylvania, Being Part of a tract of about one hundred acres of Land, et allowance, which formerly was Surveyed to Jacob Rohr by Warrant dated on the 2^d April anno 1737, who sold the same to Ludwig Kirchhoff he again to John Kantz, and afterwards to Peter Wentz, who sold the same again to George Hoeyer, who now sold the above part thereof to Jacob Doup Beginning at a stone in the Line of Jacob Kantz's Land, thence by the same South West 15 perches to a stone in the line of Jacob Hoeyer's Land, thence by the same North West 2 1/2 perches to a stone, and by the same and by land of Henry Hoeyer, South West 11 1/2 perches to a stone, set for a corner of George Hoeyer's Land, thence by the same, North West 40 perches and 2 1/2 South to a stone, thence by the same North West East 3 1/2 perches to a stone and North 65 deg East 20 perches to a stone, and North 54 deg East North West 40 perches and 2 1/2 South to the place of beginning containing Sixty five acres of Land, Street or Twenty three acres and 94 perches of Land and the usual allowance for Roads, Surveyed for the said Jacob Doup on the 6^d April 1885.
