



Situate in Allegany Township in the County of Huntington on a Branch of Little Juniata called Laurel run; Between Allegany Mountain and the Bald Eagle Ridge containing four hundred and twenty four acres & forty one perches & the usual allowance of six p<sup>ts</sup> & c<sup>t</sup> for roads.

Resurveyed the seventh day of August one thousand eight hundred and two; in pursuance of an order Number 1581 dated the eighteenth day of October one thousand seven hundred and sixty six; and of an order of the Board of Property to me directed, dated the seventh day of June one thousand eight hundred and two.

Take all the lines in this survey is found marked on the ground unless the line N 3 3/4 E 380 perches this line is dotted on the original draught and I think not run on the ground before; the Hickory corner is down, with the marks yet perceivable the white oak is yet found standing from this I am satisfied that the land is taken in as originally surveyed, although there is a difference in the quantity as well as in the length of the lines as you will see by a copy of the said draft in your possession.
