



Explanatory notes

The Red lines show a survey in the name of William Rowell made the 20<sup>th</sup> day of March 1766 on a Warrant dated the 20<sup>th</sup> of Sept: 1762 it then contained eleven hundred & sixty five Acres

The survey in the Name of William Cox was made the 15<sup>th</sup> day of May 1766 on an Order dated the 10<sup>th</sup> day of Oct: 1765 and has succeeded against the right of William Rowell

The survey in the Name of the Rev<sup>d</sup> Dr. Frances Allison was made the 14<sup>th</sup> day of October 1766 on an Order dated the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August 1766 and patented the 27<sup>th</sup> day of January 1767. The pieces marked A, B, C, D are parts of the original survey of William Rowell all not included in any other survey & the piece marked E is likewise a part of the survey of William Rowell and is included in the Proprietors manner - Situate in Hopewell Township Huntingdon County.
