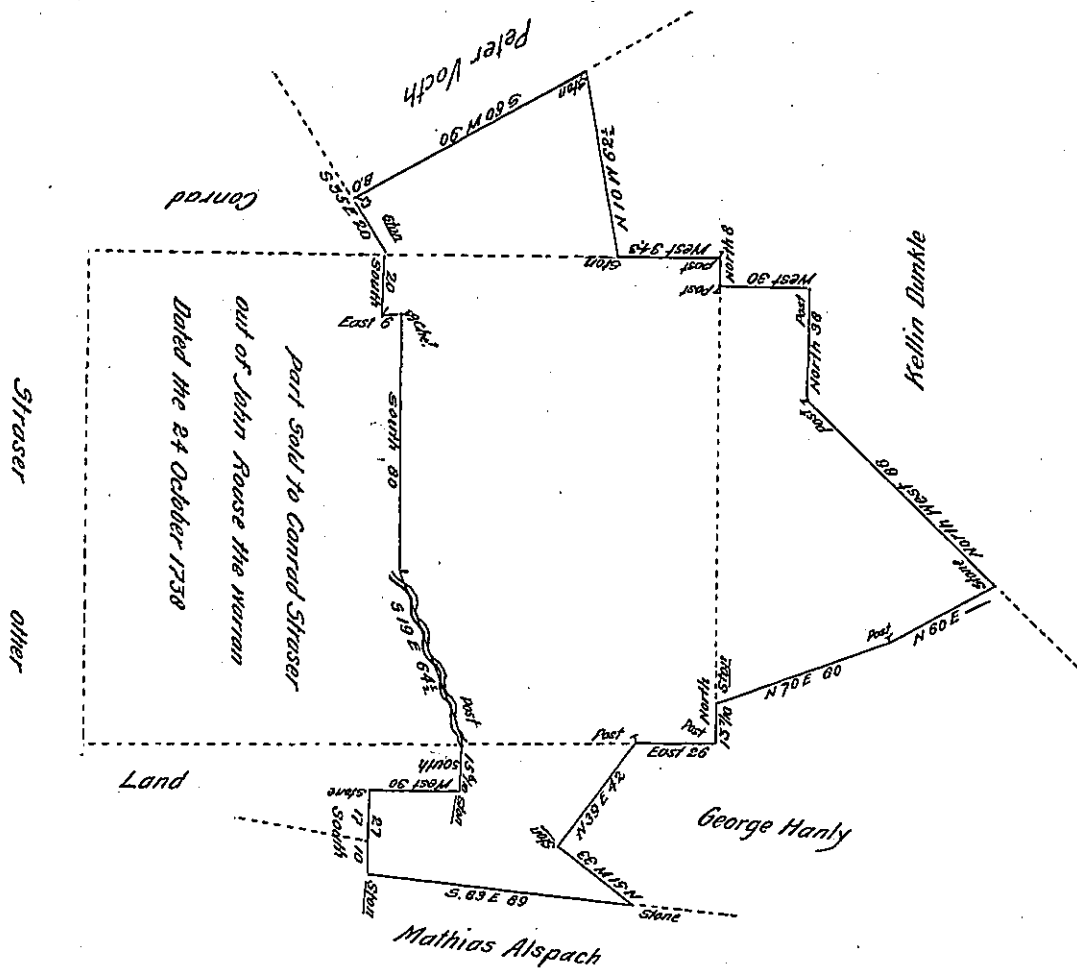

By virtue of three warrant one granted John Rouse dated the 24 day of October 1738 part sold and now in the possession Conrad Straser and the other part now Jacob Rouse who is the present possessor contains 97 acres and 128 perches and the allowance Six other warrants granted to Jacob Rouse one warrant dated the 8th day of February 1757 contains 21 acres and 14 perches and the allowance the other warrant dated the 27 february 1766 for two tract the one contains 19 acres and 24 perches and the other contains 40 acres 20 perches and the allowance the above described tract of ^{land} Rouse was the 26th day 1787 for Jacob Rouse situate in Windsor township Berks County containing one hundred and seventy eight acres 53 perches and the allowance of six per cent
