In the above, No 2 is unimproved, and no other legal claimant. No 3 is improved, and has been in part for nearly thirty years, which with No 5 unimproved (timber having been cut) is now claimed by Casper Kereiser who lives thereon. It is said he purchased of John Rupp, now deceased, for \$1.50 per acre, but if said J. Rupp should obtain a patent, then he was to pay \$3.00 per acre. No deed has been given. No 4 is owned by the heirs of said John Rupp, deceased, of whom the wife of Andrew Mc Gill in the warrant named is a daughter. I think the warrant ought to be for the use of the heirs of the said John Rupp dec^d. John Rupp's improvement has also been made some thirty years since. As the land will fall into the fourth rate, it may be necessary to get the County Commissioners to rate the same. Should the Warrant be for the use of said heirs, then Caspar Kereiser's claim would be properly included, as per contract with John Rupp, only that it ought to be for part improved land. I believe all their arrangements have been verbal. your directions in the case will be attended to.
