Sir. On Receipt of yours of the first Inst^t P. Philip Snyder, Jr went & examined the lines of the different Surveys made on the land, he holds in Hempfield, by Virtue of John Nables Sale to him. I would have Returned the 47th piece as you see P. Dist with that of the tract 10th but finding the Land which he is said to have patented, to lack the Quantity of 40th & the Allow^{ce} having examined the same with the great- est care, returns you the Dist^t of the whole, that you may see how they Surveys Interfere With each other; my Name only sign'd at bottom of the Return that it may be made out at your Pleasure fit to be Rec^d into the Office
