



By Order of the Proprietary surveyed the 25th day of July Anno Dom 1738 to John Sterat a tract of Land situate in the Township of Donegal in the County of Lancaster Beginning at a post on the line of Lodwick Metz's land thence west one hundred & seventy six perches to a hickory thence south south west ninety one per. to a white Oak thence west north west one hundred & ten per. to a hickory thence north eighty three per. to a Spanish Oak thence west eighty four perches to a white Oak thence south sixty per. to a Black Oak thence east sixty four per. to a Black Oak thence south south west sixty seven perches to a hickory thence ~~east south~~ ^{seventy three degrees east fifteen} perches to a hickory thence south south west two hundred twenty two per. to a Black Oak thence east south east one hundred seventy four per. to a Black Oak thence North North east eighty six perches to a hickory thence east one hundred seventy five perches to a Black Oak thence North twenty two Deg. & one hundred perches to a post thence North seven deg. east one hundred eighty six per. to the place of Beginning, Containing six hundred and four Acres $\frac{1}{3}$ and the allowance of six acres $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent for Roads & highways
