



To B., The red lines represents Dennis Rerders original survey containing two hundred eighty five acres sixty six perches & allowance of six per cent. The Green lines includes the land returned in right of Dennis Rerders in pursuance of an order of resurvey granted to Melker Sypodny bearing date January 4th 1815, containing 164 acres 41% perches & allowance after excluding the interferences as above represented by the diagram. The Blue lines inscribe the interference of Rerders with that of Thomas Shields & Company's survey as above delineated. The Black lines describes the survey & lines of the lands adjoining or interfering with the original survey of Dennis Rerders so far as any office rights appears to have been executed on or adjoining the same.
