



John Sinkler of West Caln Township in Chester County of common Producing sundry Recine conveyances whereby it appears he is intitled to one hundred acres of unlocated Land part of two hundred acres which the Proprietaries of Pennsylvania by their Warrant dated the 26th day of September 1761 (Reciting as therein is recited) did grant to George Ashbridge late of said County since Deceased. The above described tract of Land was surveyed the 24th anno 1774 by virtue and in pursuance of the said Warrant for the above named John Sinkler. Bounded as follows (viz) Beginning at the great Road leading from Philadelphia to Lancaster thence extending South Thirteen degrees East by other hand of the said John Sinkler one hundred and twenty-eight Perches & an half to the line of William Dawson's Land thence by the same South Seventy-four degrees West one hundred and forty-five perches to a white Oak thence by the Land of Caleb Way seated by James Pierce North seven Degrees East one hundred and Sixty-eight Perches to the said great road thence along the same North Eighty-six degrees East forty Perches and South Eighty-five degrees East fifty Perches to the place of Beginning containing one hundred acres beside the allowance of six per
