Pursuant to a Warrant to me directed under the Hand of James Irvine Esq. Vice President of the Supreme Executive Council & less Seal of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, Dated the 20th Day of December in the year 1784 Requiring 45 Acres of Land in the Haycock Township Bucks County adjoining Lands of George Fulmer Philip Weice & Jacob Barnes to be surveyed unto Conrad Mitman Junr if not already ^{surveyed} or appropriated I have surveyed unto the sd Conrad Mitman a Piece of Land situate in the Township of Haycock as aforesaid Beginning at a Stone for a Corner being also a Corner of George Fulmer's Land thence by the same S 84° W 70 Perches to Jacob Barnes' Land thence by same S 57° E 83 & S 53° W 17 thence by Land of Henry Yunker S 15° E 37 to the Line of Henry Amy's Land thence by the same & by Vacant Land N 75 1/2° E 88 to a Stone thence by Vacant Land N 39° 15' W 116 Perches to the Place of Beginning Containing forty five Acres
