



In Pursuance of a Warrant to me directed dated the 20<sup>th</sup> day of December 1775 I did on the 29<sup>th</sup> day of September 1775 survey and lay out unto Samuel Powell Esq. the Lot of Ground therein mentioned and Described and find the same to be situate on the East side of New Street, between Pine, and Cedar Streets in the City of Philadelphia containing in Breadth North and South on the East side of New Street & on the River Delaware sixty five feet and in Length East and West into the River Delaware two hundred and fifty feet. Bounded Southward by William Allen Esq.'s Lot, Westward by New Street, Northward by a Ten feet Public Alley and Eastward by the River Delaware at the extent of two hundred and fifty feet from the East side of New Street aforesaid. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 9<sup>th</sup> day of October 1775
