



A Draught of Two Tracts of Land Situ^{obl} Upper Milford Township^{obliterated} ^{obl}Smpton
 (formerly Bucks)^{obl} State of Pennsylvania^{obl} thereof the First Containing Sixty Acres of Land^{obl} together
 with the usual allowance at ^{obl} per Cent for Roads, which ^{obl} part of a Tract of 154 Acres etc. which
^{obl} originally surveyed to Philip^{obl} Sebolt by Virtue of a Warrant granted ^{obl} by the Late Proprieta-
 ries dated the 18th October Anno 1738 he the ^{obl} Sebolt sold the remainder to Jacob Teel when the
 said Tract was ^{obl} ordingly divided (as supposed by Edward Scull). The Second Tract ^{obl} contains Twen-
 ty Six Acres and one half Acre of Land and the usual allowance for Roads which was surveyed to the
 said Philip Sebolt by W^{obl} of the 8th June Anno 1745 - which said Two Tracts have in the year
 1769 been taken in Execution for Debts and were sold accordingly by John ^{obl} Kings, high sheriff of
 the Sa^{obl} County to Baltzer Featerman as by ^{obl} Deed of the 20th September 1769 will appear. Then
 the said B^{obl} Featerman, by his Deed Poll dated on the 12th April 1787 ^{obl} sold and conveyed his Right
 to the same unto his son Philip Fe^{obl} man who now intends ^{obl} get out a Patent for it formerly part
 of ^{obl} resurveyed and drawn for the said Philip Featerman on the 27th ^{obl} mber Anno 1787 - - -
