



A Draught of a Tract of Land situate in Hempfield Township in the County of Westmoreland containing Three hundred and eighteen Acres and the usual allowance of Six $\frac{1}{2}$ Cent. for Roads &c. Surveyed April 29th 1785 In pursuance of a Warrant granted to Nehemiah Stokely bearing date the 23^d day of February 1785. — Since Surveying the above described tract of Land, I have discovered that the greater part thereof, is included in the Survey of 3229 $\frac{1}{2}$ Acres claimed by the State, as the Confiscated Property of Alexander Ross; The interference is particularly delineated in the large Draught inclosed herewith: But as it is Evidenced in the deposition of Gideon Miller herewith transmitted, that the original Settlement of the Land was made, prior to the date of the Survey made by Gen^l Thompson for Alexander Ross, none of whose Applications were particular for the Ground; I must ^{respectfully} submit the Equitable Title Col^o Stokely has to this Tract of Land to the Hon^{ble} the Supreme Executive Council, agreeable to their Order.
