A Draught of a tract of Land Situate in Newbury Township in the County of York Resurveyed (by the Old Lines formerly Run,) the 8th day of July 1789 in Pursuance of a Warrant Granted to George Schneider Dated the 15th day of March 1775 Containing Eighty ~~Five~~^{SIX} Acres, and the Allowance of Six Acres ~~of~~ Cent for Roads &c

N.B. The Piece Marked with the Letter A about 24^a the Heirs of James Sharp Claims by a Warrant Dated 6th June 1774, which was granted to James Sharp, and was cut off the Survey of George Schneider made by Lewis Lewis in the year 1770, while he was Deputy for Mr. Charles Lukens, Schneider's Improvement must be upwards of 22 years old on account of a Bill of Sale which Schneider shewed me which was dated the 28th december 1767 for the above tract Saml Jones sold to Peter Tittle & Tittle sold to Schneider. Schneider is a very poor man and Bought the Whole of the Land Marked with A & B and if he loose the 24 Acres it will Effectually ruin his little Place, as Sharps Heirs insisted to have the 24^a or 25^a Mentioned in their Warrant it was cut off ~~at the~~ at the time the Resurvey was made for Schneider. The above is a State of Facts as far as came to my Knowledge.
