



This Tract of Land Resurveyed at the Request of John Parsons Lying in Wrights Town in the County of Bucks Beginning at a whit oak Standing by the Road Leading to buckingham from newtown then north west thirty seven pearch to a post then north five degrees west four hundred and sixty eight pearch by John Parson's other land and part of ben clanks land to a small whit oak then south west one hundred and fifty five pearches to a black oak by part of Buckingham Township then south one degree East three hundred and sixty pearch by John Terry's land post then south west twelve pearches to a post then South East one hundred and twenty pearch to a small black oak then north East one hundred and twenty pearches by Joseph Chapmans Land to the place of beginning Containing three hundred and Eighty eight acres of land surveyed in the 5 month 1739

The above described land was by John Cutler's Resurvey of Wrights Town called George Figg & vacant there was a pecc of land of 30 acres which belonged to the proprietor aioyner John Parson's former draught and he was willing to have it included in his draught if the proprietor and he can agree about it from John Chapman. John Parson's obtained a Warrt from the late Comm<sup>rs</sup> dated the 28<sup>th</sup> 6<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup> 1725 for 173<sup>o</sup> the Rem<sup>t</sup> of 500<sup>o</sup> the original purchase of Joseph Hall And he says he agreed with the Comm<sup>rs</sup> for a Vacancy of 150<sup>o</sup> belonging to the proprietary a Warrt to be made out of the 150<sup>o</sup> & also directions about the 30 acres. Said Warrt dated the 8<sup>th</sup> of 7ber 1740 for the whole viz<sup>t</sup> to accept & c the Surv<sup>t</sup> of 190<sup>o</sup> 52<sup>o</sup> & allowance both — Returned within one <sup>about 1<sup>st</sup> Year 1710</sup> y<sup>r</sup> 8<sup>th</sup> of 7ber 1740.
