



Thomas Williams (o-b-t) int for 200 acres of Land (an addition to his other land) which (o-b-t) Date the Sixteenth of May ¹⁷³⁸ ~~1737~~ on the 20th of 5th Month I went to Execute y^e S^d Warrant; then the Said Williams and his Neighbour John Bowen Informed me that Each of them was to have such parts of y^e S^d Land as lay Adjacent to their Respective Tracts Accordingly We Located as much Land as they thought Convenient Bounding up on & taking in part of a Very Stony Hill. And afterward Began at a post a Corner of their other Lands and Run a Line Due North to Divide between them Without any Contradiction or Debate Situate in Carraron Townp. in Lancaster County.

When I Executed the Warrant above mencon'd I Acquainted the Parties of Jesse Woodward having Obtained a Warrant Which seem'd to answer to the Said Spot Now Since the Said Survey I am Credibly Inform'd that Thomas Williams takes the Liberty to Assume the Whole taking the advantage of y^e S^d Bowen because ye Warrant was in the Name of S^d Williams which has put Bowen upon Making a purchase of the Right of Jesse Woodward Whose Warrant is Dated the 3^d Day of December 1737 By Virtue Whereof the above S^d Seventy Eight Acres Ought to have been Surveyed.

It is now agreed between them the Tract shall be equally divid^d as above shew^d by the black line on a Course from the former divisⁿ N 65 E 22 per 10 ft thence 89 3/4 thence S 63 W &c.
