



The Draught of the Land of John Thomas. Situate in Nantmeal Township in the County of Chester. Beginning at a Black Oak Corner of the Land of John Marsh. Thence by the Land of Abram Scott South West 80 pches to a Chesnut Tree. Thence by Edward Goughs Land North 47<sup>d</sup> West 133 fches to a Black Oak, and South 43<sup>d</sup> West 10 pches to a Post. Thence by William Kirk's Land & Vacant Land North 36<sup>d</sup> West 188 pches to a Post. Thence by Vacant Land North 20<sup>d</sup> West 16 pches to a Hickry Tree. Thence by Land of Sam: John South 80<sup>d</sup> East 36 pches to a Birch. South 18<sup>d</sup> East 68 pches to a Stone and North 85<sup>d</sup> East 135 pches to a Post. Thence by the Land of John Marsh South 25<sup>d</sup> East 16 pches to a Black Oak. East 22 pches to a Hickry and South 25<sup>d</sup> East 132 pches to the place of Beginning Containing one Hundred and forty Three Acres beside the Allowance of Six Cent
