



By virtue of a Warrant dated the 27<sup>th</sup> day of November 1868, Surveyed the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of December 1868, to Johnson Swackhamer, the above described tract piece or parcel of land, situate near and Eastward of Moosic Mountain, in Canaan Township, Wayne County Bounded as follows, Beginning at a White ash tree, the Corner of land of Frank Hollenback and of Trueman Sharp, Thence by land of Said Sharp South forty four degrees West, Nineteen rods to an old original Stones corner, Thence by land of Warren D. Berry, (late William Swackhamer's) North forty Six degrees West two hundred and Sixty five Rods to an original Warrantee Stones Corner, Thence by land in the Warrantee name of John White North forty four degrees East, Nineteen Rods to an original Stones Corner, and thence by lands of Franklin M. Mullen and George Rix South forty six degrees East two hundred and Sixty five Rods to the place of Beginning, Containing Twenty Nine Acres and One hundred and ten perches and Allowance of Six per Cent. (lying between two tracts of land and not included in Either.)

The North assumed in the above Survey, is the meridian by which the adjoining lands were located, and is 4° West of the North indicated by the Standard Meridian of Wayne County, P. G. Goodrich, County Surveyor.
