



A Draught of a Tract of Land Situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philadelphia in the State of Pennsylvania. Being Part of a Tract of 235<sup>as</sup> 37 perches, et Allowance. That was formerly Surveyed to Jacob Whiteman, by Virtue of Two Warrants The first was granted to his father John Whiteman dated on The 27<sup>th</sup> January Anno 1738. The second was granted to the said Jacob Whiteman (al Wightman.) by a Warrant or Ticket dated on the 11<sup>th</sup> March Anno 1746. The Right to the whole was after the Death of Both By authority of the Orphans Court conveyed to Andrew Whiteman as eldest Son of the said Jacob Whiteman deceased. Who now Sold the above Part thereof to Yost Hollebush Beginning at a Stone a Corner of William Beyers Land. Thence by the same North West 138 perches to a Stone in the Line of Henry Beyers Land. thence by the same North East, 38 perches to a Stone. now a Corner of Michael Gougler's Land. thence by the same North 84 degrees East 48 perches to a Stone. and South 10 deges East 18 perches to a white Oak. and by the same North 69 1/2 degrees East 118 perches to a Stone on Pirkiome Creek. thence by the said Creeck downwards. South 73 degrees East 30 perches to a Stone a Corner of John Kreyders One acre tract, thence by the same South 20 degs West 7 perches to a Spanish Oak Sapling. and South 70 degs East 23 perches to a Stone in the Line of John Harbenstein & (late Ludwig Lerman's) Land. thence by the same South West 152 perches to a Stone in the Line of Late Wyant Teel's now John Heebners Land. thence by the same North West 5 perches to a Stone. and South West 37 perches to the Place of Beginning. Containing One Hundred acres and 24 Perches of Land. together with the usual Allowance of six per Cent for Roads. Divided on the 31<sup>st</sup> August Anno 1773. and now Drawn on the 17<sup>th</sup> March Anno 1779. for Yost Hollebush.
