



A Draugh of a Tract of Land Situate in Frederick Township in the County of Philadelphia and Province of Pennsylvania. Being Part of 235 acres, etc. partly surveyed to John Whiteman by Warrant of the 27<sup>th</sup> January 1738, and partly to Jacob Whiteman by application of the 11<sup>th</sup> March 1746. The same was afterwards sold to Dietrich Welker who now sold the above part thereof unto George Whiteman. —

Beginning at a Stone, a Corner of Henry Beyer's Land thence by the same North 15<sup>degrees</sup> West 49 perches to a Stone, a Corner of the said George Whitemans other Land, thence by the same North 70<sup>degrees</sup> East 147 perches to a white oak, in the line of Samuel Shulers Land, thence by the same South East 20 perches to the middle of Perkjorne Creek thence in the said Creek downwards South 15<sup>degrees</sup> East 40 perches, and South 26<sup>degrees</sup> East 18 perches, and South 73<sup>degrees</sup> East 4 perches (Being by Dietrich Welkers Forge Land) to a Corner of the said Dietrich Welkers other Land (which is part of the above said whole Tract.) Thence by the same South 69 1/2<sup>degrees</sup> West 118 perches to a white Oak, and North 10<sup>degrees</sup> West 18 perches to a Stone, and by the same South 84<sup>degrees</sup> West 48 perches to the Place of Beginning. —

Containing Sixty Six acres of Land, together with the usual allowance of Six per Cent for Roads — Surveyed and Divided for the said George Whiteman on the 31<sup>st</sup> August Anno 1773. —
