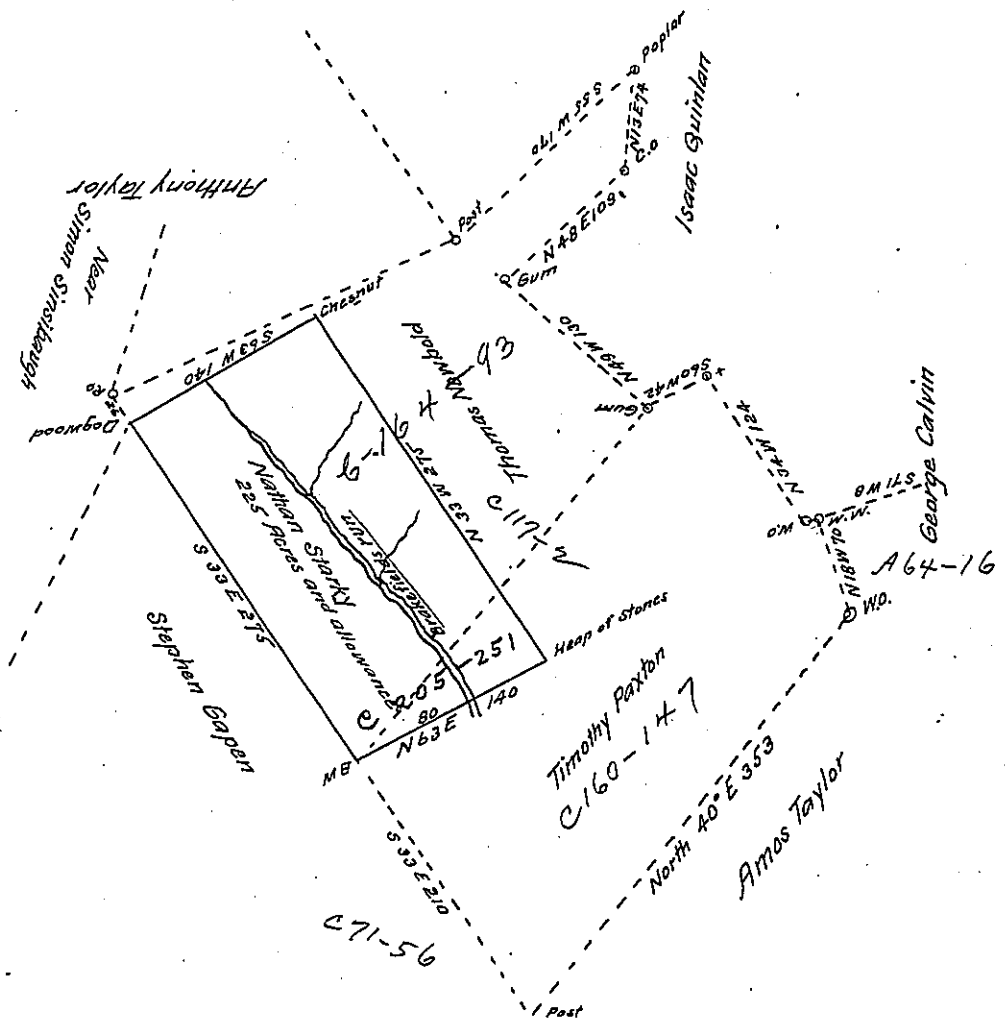

The above was Constructed for Patenting from the Original Survey and the resurvey or part which was patented 10th April 1845.



The above is a Draught of a Survey made November 21st 1818 containing 225 Acres and allowance of 6 per cent in pursuance of a Warrant granted Nathan Starkey bearing date September 24th 1818 Situate in Whitely township Greene County on the waters of Dunkard Creek

To Jacob Spangler Esq^r S.G. John Fordyce D.S
N. B. there is an actual resident settlement on the above survey which has been continued I believe upwards of 21 years John Fordyce

The lower survey represented by dotted lines (Stephen Gaper says) was granted to Timothy Paxton by Warrant bearing date 14th of April 1794. the upper survey granted Thomas Newbold Warrant same date. I cannot determine precisely the dates of surveys, but believe them to be September 1794. After the most diligent search I can't find any old lines or corners marked except on the East were they bound on Calvin, Quinlan &c And the line joining Amos Taylor which was run and marked by Stephen & John Gaper a few Months since. I know nothing of the present Owners nor the Patentees of the above surveys John Fordyce
