



Surveyed to George Weir 13<sup>th</sup> of July 1841 the above described piece of land containing fourteen acres and one hundred and sixty four perches & allowance of Six per Cent adjoining land Surveyed to Roger Hart Blacklick creek and land warranted to Charles Campbell situated in Blacklick township Indiana County and containing an improvement viz about an acre to an acre & a half of a field which was cleared (as nigh as my recollection serves me) some time from the year 1827 to 1830. It also contains an improvement of a house and fenced lot prepared and constructed last winter and Spring and now occupied in opposition to his Weirs claim By Warrant of the 30<sup>th</sup> day of March 1841.

N.B. Walter Bell Thomas Bell and John Hartsock each for themselves respectively caveat the survey or object to the return and set up a claim to the land in whole or in part and also James M<sup>c</sup>Cormack who is in possession of of the land opposed the survey to threatened violence.
