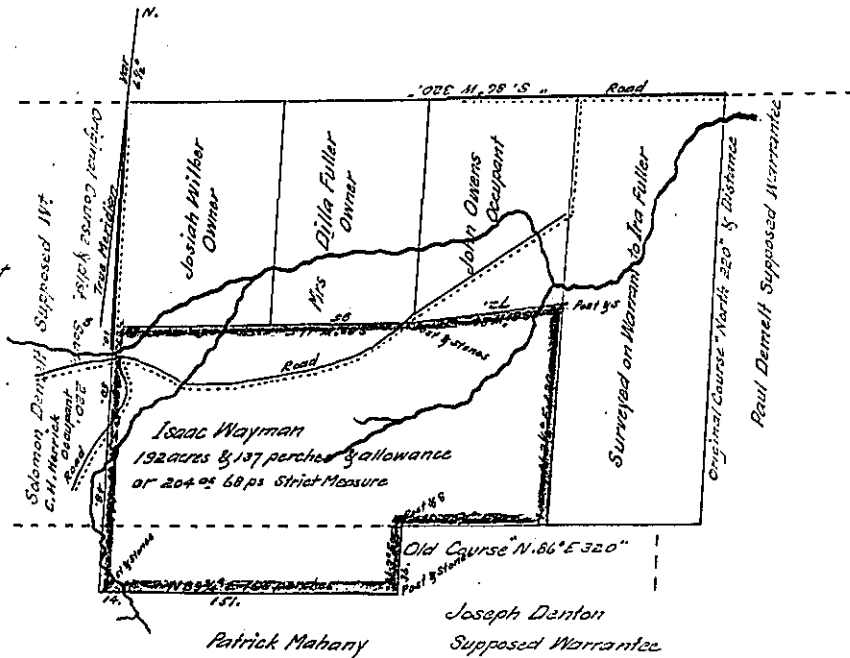


Scale 80 perches to the inch

Draft of a tract of land (partly improved since April, 1. 1873) situate in Liberty township Susquehanna County bounded as follows, to wit: Beginning at a post & stones in the West line of a lot lately surveyed on a Warrant to Ira Fuller, Thence by a lot occupied by John Owens, South 81° West Eighty four perches to a post & stones: Thence by lots of Mrs. Della Fuller and Josiah Wilber, South 89° West one hundred & sixty five perches to a corner in a public road. Thence by land of said Wilber and a lot occupied by C. H. Herrick, South 3° West, one hundred & forty one perches to a post & stones: Thence North 89 3/4° East one hundred and sixty five perches to a post & stones, and North 3° East thirty six perches to a post & stones. Thence N. 89 3/4° East eighty two perches, to a post & stones, a corner of the lot surveyed for Ira Fuller. (the last three Courses supposed to join lands of Patrick Mahony.) Thence by said Fullers lot North three & a quarter degrees East one hundred & twenty perches to the beginning, Containing one hundred & ninety two acres & 137 perches and allowance of six per cent. or two hundred & four acres & 68 perches strict measure., Surveyed January 21st 1880, in pursuance of an ^{Improvement} Warrant to Isaac Wayman, bearing date January 6. 1880, for 200 acres.

I have to append to this Return another cautionary Note, as I apprehend the main part of the land is a part of that same tract surveyed "April 28th 1785, on a Warrant dated April 5. 1785 granted to Samuel Demelt," and a portion appears by the maps to be covered by a Warrant to "Joseph Denton" of same date probably both probably described as being on tributary waters of Snake Creek, in the then County of Luzerne or Northumberland. You

have probably the surveys on file. IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg, this
