



Draught of two hundred forty nine acres 137 perches of Land and allow^g of six per cent for roads &c. Situate in Armagh Township Mifflin County - Surveyed the 19th of May 1837 in pursuance of a Warrant to James Robb dated 26th day of Decbr. 1836.

To John Taylor Esqr. Surveyor General of Penn for W^m Shaw.

The original lines marked thus x run by W^m Harris for Tho^s Brown 1st April 1796 and appear to contain 131^a 20^p by his Calculation filed in the Deputy Surveyors office of Mifflin County. The lines marked thus I run by W^m Harris June 14th 1805. Beginning at Gum on South East corner of survey and from thence the several Courses and distances to Ch. ok. corner, on South west Corner of survey, which now stands in ^{the} Mathew Longwell survey and there quit, leaving an open line from Ch. ok. to Maple and finding he had more land than he could return on 150 acre warrant. It appears by his Draft he then Calculated the East part of the addition to the County line which appear on his Draft to be 48^a 156 perches and allow^g which added to 131^a 20^p made 180^a 16^p including 20 acres surplus land above what the warrant called for. I can not find any other Draft or field notes in my office of a survey made on that Ground except the above &c.

Note - When locating Jas. Robbs warrant he directed me to leave Mr. Brown what his warrant called for, I did so with about six or eight acres of surplus land, Insisting that he had paid the State for it and Mr. Brown had not &c.
