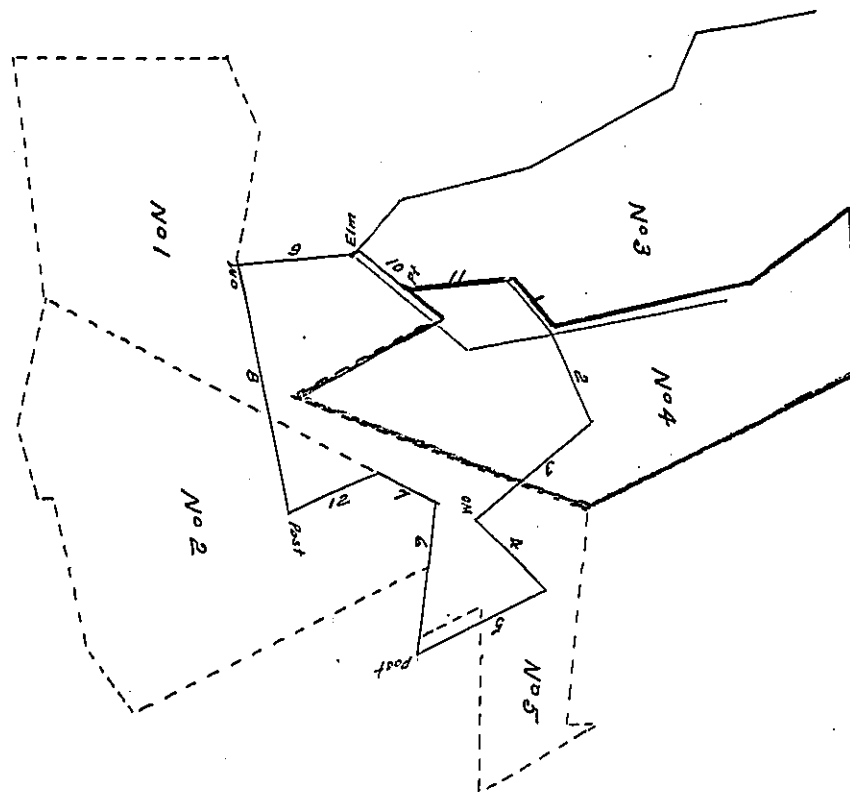

A Draft of A tract of Land situate on the Raystown Branch of Juniatta - In Napier township Bedford County - containing one Hundred and Ninety five Acres & forty perches and Allowance of six per Cent for roads &c. surveyed for William Thompson the 31st day of May 1799 - on Warrant dated the 7th day of July 1762. No 1 represented by the dotted lines is a Draft of A tract of Land surveyed for James Young on Warrant dated the 20th day of October 1762 - This tract Interferes forty Eight Acres and one hundred & sixty seven perches with the William Thompson tract - James Young conveyed to James Burd Esqr. who devised the same to Joseph Strippen who conveyed to Samuel Swift the present owner - No 2 represented also by dotted lines is A draft of A tract of Land Surveyed for Adam Hoops the 23rd day of October 1790 on Warrant dated the 9th day of June 1762 - This tract interferes twelve Acres and one hundred & nineteen perches with the William Thompson survey - Adam Hoops conveyed to James Brotherton from whom the same was sold by the Commissioners of Bedford County to Dr. John Anderson the present owner - No 3 represented by the Lake Coloured Lines is a Draft of A tract of Land Surveyed for John Gibson on Warrant dated the 15th day of September 1762 - This interferes fourteen Acres & one hundred & fifty four perches with the William Thompson Survey - John Gibson conveyed to John Cessna who conveyed to Johnathan Cessna who conveyed to Richard Delapt who devised the same to John Williams the present owner - No 4 represented by the Blue lines is A Draft of a Tract of Land Surveyed for John Barron on Warrant dated the 24th day of March 1794 - Surveyed the 25th day of November 1817 - This tract Interferes Eighty four Acres and Ninety nine perches with the William Thompson tract - John Barron conveyed to George Woods whose Executors conveyed to Alexander McVicker the present owner - No 5 represented by broken lines is a draft of A tract of Land surveyed for William Holloway the 25th day of November 1817 - on Warrant dated the 14th day of June 1794 - this tract interferes Thirty one Acres with the William Thompson tract - William Holloway conveyed to George Woods whose Executors conveyed to Alexander McVicker the present owner
