Granted to Joseph Eaton for 50 Acres joining his other Land in Antrim Township, And by virtue of a contract with the Board of Property for ascertaining surveying and returning unpatented Lands under Proprietary rights &c. Report. The above described Tract is wholly included within the lines of a Survey of 120 3/4 Acres, made for Joseph Eaton sent on the 29th September 1785, on his Warrant bearing ^{date} the 17th of February 1785 and is owned and occupied by Michael Palmer under the title found on said Warrant of 1785

Note Although the above Warrant of 1750 does not particularly Locate the above Land, more than other Land adjoining the said Joseph Eaton; yet it appears that in 1753 the above part Returned was recognized as claimed by John Eaton and the improvements adjoining said Joseph Eaton in 1750 were all of Ancient date - It is rather presumed than otherwise properly ascertained; that the Warrant of 1750 was intended to cover the above Tract now Returned, W. S. Davis
