



A Draught of a Tract of Land called the Old Town Situate on the S.W. Side of the S.W. Branch of Dunnings Creek above the Forks including James & William Clark's Improvements begun in the year 1761 and including the "big Spring" in the Township & county of Bedford containing three hundred & twenty seven acres & the usual Allowance of Six Cent for Roads &c.
