N: 2 represented by the dotted and black lines is a draft of a tract of Land Surveyed for Co! Henry Boquet on Warrant dated the 7<sup>th</sup> day of July 1762 - this tract interferes Two Hundred and Ninety Eight and three fourths of Acres with the Charles Williams Survey - Co! Henry Boquet devised the same to Sir Frederick Haldimond who devised the same to Anthony Francis Haldimond who conveyed to Isacc Fickes who devised the same to Peter Shimer the present owner ~ N.B. James Laugam claims part of Charles Williams joining David Pressal on the North and Co! Henry Boquet on the east by virtue of an settlement made in the year 1808 ~ upon which no survey has been made ~
