



A Draft of a tract of Land situate on the East branch of Dummings Creek In 5th Clair Township Bedford County containing Eight Hundred & twenty and ten perches and allowance of six per Cent for Roads &c. Surveyed for John Little on Warrant dated the 1st day of June 1763.

N°1. Represented by green lines is part of a Draft of A tract of Land surveyed for George Imler on Warrant dated the 12th day of June 1794. This tract interferes Ninety acres and one hundred and twenty perches with the John Little survey. George Imler's Executor conveyed to Thomas Croyle the present owner.

N°2 represented by dotted lines is part of a draft of a tract of land surveyed for Ephriam Williams on Warrant dated the 22nd day of August 1785. This tract Interferes seventy one acres and ninety eight perches with the John Little Survey. Ephriam Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom it was sold by the Sherriff of Bedford County to Isaac Fiches who devised his part thereof to John Fiches the present owner.

N°3 represented by dotted lines is a part of a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for James Williams on Warrant dated the 22nd day of August 1785. this tract Interferes sixty acres with the John Little tract. James Williams conveyed to Thomas Vickroy from whom it was sold by the sherriff of Bedford County to Frederick Dupps the present owner.

N°4 represented by dotted lines is a part of a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Jacob Burkhardt on Warrant dated the 9th day of May 1794. This tract interferes one Hundred and ninety six acres and twenty perches with the John Little survey. Jacob Burkhardt after obtaining the said Warrant Bought from Thomas Stewartson acting as agent for the Executors of Millard & Roberts & Neate & Pegew who Claimed under John Little. Jacob Burkhardt is the present owner.

N°5. represented by dotted lines is a part of a draft of a tract of Land surveyed for Henry Wertz on Warrant dated the 22nd day of August 1785. this tract interferes Six acres and one hundred and thirty five perches with the John Little survey. Henry Wertz conveyed to William Proctor (who also bought from Dr. Smith and others who claimed under John Little). he conveyed to John Garn who devised one part thereof to John Garn Jr. the present owner the residue he devised to Frederick Garn whose Administrator conveyed to John Cristman the present owner. N.B. George King claims part of this tract by virtue of a settlement commenced ten years ago upon which no survey has been made.
